Welcome to our Annual Review of 2011 which outlines our activities during the year and brings much encouragement as we recognise God's many blessings over the last year.

Congregations

GBC is an amazing mixture of people. Almost everyone at GBC finds a home in one of our four congregations: **Sunday morning Celebration, Songs of Praise, D-Caf,** and **Generation Rising**. The diversity of style and content of each congregation can provide each of us with a meaningful place to worship God. When our congregations meet, they are also places of learning and prayer. Our local mission activities feed into our congregations and our cell groups give people deeper and closer relationships for discipleship and support.



During 2011, many new people have begun to be part of our church family. Seven people testified to their faith in believers' baptism, 5 people became church members, and we shared 7 dedications of children. We gave time in 2011 to a series of "Meet the Team" events when our vision of life at GBC was shared with everyone.

Prayer surrounds everything we do, but from time to time we set aside special times for concentrated prayer. Of special note were the "Stations of The Cross" week before Easter, the 24 hours we spent praying for one of our sick church members, and the day of prayer regarding our church finances. We support world mission across all our congregations, regularly sharing news of people overseas who are linked to GBC.



Many people enable us to celebrate the goodness of God, to share our lives with each other and to make disciples in all our congregations. We thank them for giving their time and gifts and for sharing their servant hearts.

SUNDAY MORNINGS

Our **Sunday morning congregation** has continued to grow and we continue to use every inch of space, having re-designed, re-decorated and re-allocated some of the rooms for our growing children's and youth ministry during the year! We have benefitted from preaching series on 2 Corinthians (Jars of Clay), Revelation (Marks of a Great Church), Ruth (Redeeming Ruth), and Isaiah (Born to Die), as well as short series on Heaven Unearthed and Men of God. Our growing band of worship leaders and musicians have led us in sung worship and others have used their gifts to help us draw near to God. We are glad that a number are also able to use their gifts in support of other local churches, including regularly leading worship at Yelling Baptist Church and Medway Christian Fellowship.

SUNDAY EVENINGS

The content and style of our **Sunday evening services** varies from week to week but regularly includes: Healing and communion services, Café Style services and a focus on one of our overseas or local missions.

SONGS OF PRAISE

Every third Sunday at 4.00pm, our well established **Songs of Praise** congregation meets for a short service with well loved hymns, readings, prayers and a short talk. About 50 then stay and enjoy tea together – and the chance to meet others and spend time chatting. We have enjoyed looking at themes such as 'Life's Changes' and 'You are never alone'. It has been a real joy this year to see a growing




number of people from our Tuesday Lunch Club attending Songs of Praise and feeling that it is their spiritual home.

GENERATION RISING

New for 2011

Our **Generation Rising** Youth congregation meets 3 times a month on Sunday evenings at 7.00pm and once a month for small groups in people's homes.



Our **D-Caf congregation** for 16+ year olds has continued to meet each Wednesday evening in term time for a meal, followed by a talk, a testimony and small group discussion of various themes. D-Caf has seen new people joining over the past year (including new babies!) and others really growing in their faith which has led to some coming to faith. We held a fantastic baptismal service on a Wednesday evening – attended by people from all our congregations. There are many personal struggles and some very difficult life stories but we are seeing weddings and dedications

which are a healthy sign of people wanting to get their lives on track with God. D-Caf takes time and effort, but all of that is worth it when people share testimony of what God is doing in their lives. We have had many new people join us in 2011 although they do not all come every week. Your prayers for the busy pastoral care that is part of this work are very much appreciated.

Cells

We continue to work out our vision of being a small group community in many ways with people 'loving, learning, doing and deciding' together – whether that is in a prayer triplet, a team working together in many of our services, activities and events, or a cell group.

Our small group structure is primarily based around our **cell groups**. Thirteen groups meet on a weekly basis for caring, sharing, praying, studying, worshipping and reaching out.

"At Friday Group (10am at GBC) our evangelistic outlook has been via Alpha and meals and the Christmas coffee morning. This has enabled us to make contact with many people some of whom have continued with Friday Group and church. Bible studies have been by John Ortberg – on the theme of Faith. FOOD BANK PROJECT New for 2011



A new community project, supported by all our congregations and headed up by our young people, is the Food Bank. People donate tinned and packet food with long use by dates so that we can respond to requests for help in crisis situations. About 30 food parcels have been given out during 2011.
