# "THE GOD WHO EMPOWERS"

The word **empower** means to give authority or permission.

The Holy Spirit is God's presence and power in our lives.

God grants us the authority to live a Christ-like life.

The good news is that the Holy Spirit empowers us to reach this goal.

When we step out in faith to follow Jesus, God gives us power from within to do so.

### The Holy Spirit pardons us.

We don't earn God's love by changing ourselves; instead, God accepts us as we are. We change because of God's love and ongoing offer of new beginnings.

#### The Holy Spirit perfects us.

Conversion is an ongoing process of turning from sin and embracing what is good and true. By staying focused on Christ, the Spirit helps us identify and remove negative traits, making room for positive growth that benefits others.

# The Holy Spirit gives us peace.

We are not perfect in love, but the Spirit gives us peace by guiding us. Our peace doesn't come from feeling superior, but from a fuller life through our relationship with God. This inner peace frees us from proving ourselves or acting self-righteous. With God's help, we let go of pride, prejudice, and hatred, allowing us to live peacefully.

#### The Holy Spirit gives us power.

The Spirit helps us accept others, forgive those who hurt us, and love our enemies. This enables Christians to do what is right, even in difficult times, by providing strength to avoid gossip, harmful actions, and to follow through on positive intentions.

## The Holy Spirit gives us purpose.

The Holy Spirit provides us with gifts for ministry, enabling us to serve as the body of Christ and share our abilities to help others.

#### **HOW TO BE EMPOWERED BY GOD**

God's empowerment for ministry and maturity begins by making ourselves available to the Holy Spirit.

#### "Here I am, Lord, send me."

We must connect with Christ.

- Through prayer and worship. We give our hearts to God and grow in the heart of Christ.
- Through the study of the Bible. We give our minds to Christ and grow in the mind of Christ.
- Through Christian action or service our relationship with God bears fruit. We give our hands to God and grow in the work of Christ.
- Through supporting one another in our church community. We are many branches on the vine, giving strength to one another, coming alive together in Christ, learning to count ourselves as no better than others and having in us the mind that was in Christ Jesus, helping one another stay rooted and grounded in God's love.
